Martinmas Festival

Martin is celebrated as a young soldier who, when passing on a winter's evening under an archway in the city of Amiens, discovered a poor beggar huddled and shivering. On seeing him, Martin took his own cape from his shoulders, tore the garment in half and covered the poor man to warm him. The following night Martin had a dream in which he saw Christ wearing the same piece of his cape. The experience confirmed in him his devotion to all mankind, regardless of their station in life. Martin went on to become the patron saint of beggars, drunkards and outcasts. He was known for his gentleness, his unassuming nature and his ability to bring warmth and light to those who were previously in darkness. On the evening of Martinmas he is remembered with a festival of lanterns, carrying light throughout the darkness.

The traditional way of celebrating Martinmas is with lantern walks accompanied by singing. St Martin recognised the divine spirit in the poor man of Amiens and gave it the protection of his own cloak. When we make a paper lantern we too may feel that we are giving protection to our own "flame" that was beginning to shine at Michaelmas, so that we may carry it safely through the dark world. It may only be a small and fragile light – but every light brings relief to the darkness.

This Friday we will celebrate the festival of Martinmas. We will have a morning assembly for classes 1-5 and a traditional lantern walk at 5.30pm for classes 1, 2 & 3, who will then process with their lanterns through the playground and to the retired nurses home next door. Parents and siblings are

invited to accompany the children and to join in with the songs. After singing 2 or 3 songs to the retired nurses the children will process back to the Early Years courtyard to be greeted by Class 4 and 5 children around a bonfire where they will receive hot apple juice and roasted seeds. There will also be a lucky dip organised by Class 5.

Glimmer lantern, glimmer, Little lights a'shimmer...

We are busy making our own star-lanterns and, as darkness gathers, nothing daunted, we will be wending our way with them through the night-landscape on our lantern walks, (Kindergartens on Thursday, Playgroup and Parents & Toddlers on Monday); an abiding memory for the children (and their parents).

Please remember that even though children may step straight from home to car to school, they need to come equipped to enjoy the walks with warm enough coats, hats, gloves and footwear. These are also needed now to comfortably benefit from outdoor play-time.

A partial summary of Dr Bodo's talks last half term – for those who couldn't attend.

The physical body of a child and his/her soul life are linked by the so-called 'life body' which is being formed during the first 7 years of life. The key characteristics of this life body, rhythm and repetition, provide the child with a means of imitating other people. If the adult being imitated is engaged in activity that they find meaningful the child will develop the habit/expectation that their own activity should feel meaningful as a child and also later in life.

In general asking a young child questions, particularly those along the lines of "what shall we do today? or "do you want a banana or an apple in your lunch box?" make demands on the young child that work against the life body and its imitative wonders.

Only through movement do we make future possibilities a reality (our children did not come into being by our thinking!) Watching television does not require movement and so we do not become part of the social future by watching it. (If TV is part of one's life balance watch with movement activity.) Modern society today is very much led by the visual. Fixed visual pictures, like those of television, leave nothing to our individual imaginations and consequently limit our inner freedom. Living, thinking, creating rich, imagin-ative "inner pictures" keeps us healthy. Similarly, in the classroom, fixed definitions have a dead quality compared to living characterisation that can be added to and developed as the child matures.

Imagine a farmyard with three types of animal: the hen with her nervous questioning and quick to take fright, the cow endlessly digesting grass but not very aware of her surroundings and the farm cat who has the freedom to dart around faster than the hen or having had the cream, then rest purring rhythmically with greater contentment than the cud-chewing cow. Waldorf education aspires to lead the children to the freedom and well being of the cat (nit free if possible!) Anna & Henry

GCSE Results.

We are pleased to be hosting the GCSE awards ceremony for last year's Class 10 pupils next Monday evening at 6.30pm. There were some changes to the original published results following enquiries by candidates and the final results table now looks like this:

100% pass across all subjects 69% A-C across all subjects:

Art 100% Music 100% English 92% Maths 50% French 55% German 33%

The English, Music and Art results were very good, with the French, German and Maths being more average. This reflects the mixed abilities of the group. All the students are now following courses of Further Education, either A level, Vocational or GCSE based at local 6th Form Colleges.

34 lb / 337g plain flour

1/4 oz / 7.5g bicarbonate of soda

½ oz / 12.5g ground ginger

1/4 oz / 7.5g ground cinnamon

1/4 oz / 7.5g mixed spice

4 oz / 112.5g soft brown sugar

4 oz / 112.5g butter/margarine

½ lb / 225g treacle or golden syrup evaporated milk or water to mix

Heat butter in pan with syrup and sugar. Stir in all dry ingredients and make into a firm but pliable dough.

A piece on Martinmas by Mercie Dodd, Class 9

For Martinmas for 4 mornings Class 9 and 10 went to a homeless shelter to do odd jobs and help out. When we got back to school I wrote a little phrase on different people's opinions on homeless people. I wrote a bit on shopkeepers, children, police, the homeless themselves, volunteers, religious people, neighbourhood, Government/ Council and I wrote a bit on my opinions at the end. Try to work out who would say what.

"I want to help these people but I can't have them sleeping round the streets. It scares my children."

"I don't mind them sleeping there one or two nights but I don't want to have more homeless people on my doorstep, it's just not fair."

"You can't sleep here you're going to have to move on."

"It annoys me when the police and other people move me on - I'm just trying to sleep."

"Mum why doesn't that man go home?"

"These people need to be helped and cared for. We are trying to help these people but it takes time and money."

"People feel that all homeless people are bad people but most of them are good people going through a bad time in their lives."


CRECHE – one CRB checked volunteer needed on Friday between 1 and 3pm. Please phone Carol.
